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## A message from our Principal



Dear parents,

We have had an enjoyable week in school this week and it has been lovely to see the progress being made in classes. I have been overwhelmed with the fantastic response to our upcoming gardening club - it is great to see so many of the children wanting to play a part in sustainable food growth, living simply and caring for our common home. I will have further information very shortly about how the gardening club will run and how each class will care for the outdoor area that we now have access to in school. The children are excited about the upcoming Coronation celebrations and we would like to invite you to school at 2:50pm next Friday to join in the National Anthem on the school playground and to hear our Coronation song that the children have been learning. All of the children are welcome to wear red, white and blue on Friday and we will begin the day with whole school Mass at 9:10am.

As well as this, the children will take part in an activity in the afternoon where they will use sustainable, natural resources such as leaves and twigs to decorate an outline of the King's Coronation emblem or crown. Please could I ask that the children try to collect some natural resources over the next few days to use and bring them into school in a bag from Wednesday next week? Our intention is to highlight King Charles's commitment to preserving the natural environment as well as our own commitment to answering Pope Francis's call to protect our common home within the Ladauto Si' encyclical. We hope that the final outcome will be very effective!

# Children's liturgy – 4th Sunday of Easter (John 10: 1-10)



In today's reading Jesus tells us a parable in which he is the gate which takes us to God. But can you remember what Jesus says, right at the end of today's gospel?

Jesus says, "I have come so that you might have life – life in all its fullness."

What do you think it means to have life in all its fullness?

Living life to the full doesn't mean having all the latest toys or the coolest clothes or the biggest house.

And it doesn't even mean just having all the things we need in life, like enough food and somewhere safe to live, although this is a really important part of living life to the full.

It also means being the best person that we can be, living our lives well and having the chance to use all our gifts and talents for the good of all.

What gifts and talents do you have? What are you good at?

Do you always make the most of the gifts that you have? Do you always try to be the best person you can be?

Lima, a city in Peru, is extremely dry, with very little rain. Which means that it faces many challenges, particularly when it comes to the climate.

Lima is surrounded by a chain of mountains called the Lomas de Lima. Lomas means 'hills'. These mountains are very important and are known as Lima's 'green lung'. But despite their importance they are under threat from pollution and mining.

But children in schools in Lima are doing what they can to protect them. Supported by CAFOD, a local organisation called CIDAP have set up an eco-brigade in four local schools.

Gloria is 11 and is a member of one of the eco-brigades. She says: "If I could change the world, I would collect water and grow plants. If there are no plants, there is no life. They give us life; they protect us so that we can breathe fresh air."

Gloria and the other members of the eco-brigades are using their talents to protect the Lomas and to make the world a better place for their community and for all of us.

Let's do all that we can this week to live our own lives to the full – doing all that we can to be the best people we can be and using our gifts and talents for the good of others.

And let's also do all that we can to help others to live their lives to the full too – people here who we see every day and our brothers and sisters around the world.

What will you do this week to live life to the full and to help others to do the same?

We pray together to God, who comes to give us life to the full:


We pray for world leaders: that they may do all that they can to make sure all their people have the chance to live life to the full. Lord, in your mercy...

Ofsted agreed that we are continuing to develop an ambitious curriculum so that in all areas the children are able to achieve well and use the techniques that they have been taught to tackle a variety of challenges. Our curriculum is rooted in the teachings of the Gospel and Catholic Social Teachings so we make links with the children's learning to areas such as caring for our world, the dignity of workers, developments for the common good and more.

Please make sure your child is in school every day unless ill. Remember illnesses such as colds can be managed well with Calpol and although children can feel unwell first thing in a morning they do tend to brighten up during the day. We will always contact you if we are concerned that your child has become unwell throughout the day.

If there is no reason provided for your child's absence an unauthorised code is marked in the register. This will impact your child's overall attendance. Please contact school before 8.55am where possible and leave a message . If we are not aware of why your child is not in school we will try and contact you, if we are unable to contact the parent/carer we may call one of the other contacts on your child's records.

Please try to be as punctual as possible, we have noticed a small number of children are arriving late to school. If your child arrives after the close of the registration period (9.05am) this again is recorded as an unauthorised absence on the register and will affect your child's overall attendance figure. If your child arrives at school after 8.55am they MUST be accompanied by a parent/carer for signing in purposes.

In line with Government guidance all pupils who test positive for COVID-19 are recorded as ill in the register.

# **Pupil Premium and Free School Meals**



If your child is eligible for 'free school meals' and you register them for this, we'll receive extra funding called 'pupil premium'. We use this extra money to improve the educational provision and resources at the school.

What is pupil premium funding?

Pupil premium funding from the government is given to schools to help pupils reach their full potential, regardless of their background or financial situation. It's provided for pupils who:

- Are registered for free school meals
- Have been registered for free school meals at any point in the past 6 years
- Are, or have been, in care
- Have parents in the armed forces at St Joseph's Catholic Primary School,

We get an extra [£1,385 (for primary schools) / £985 (for secondary schools) – these figures are for the 2022/2023 financial year] for every eligible pupil who is registered for free school meals. This extra money could make a real difference to the quality of education we offer.

For example, we've previously used pupil premium funding for:

- Educational provision/resources
- Academic interventions
- Wellbeing and self-esteem building interventions

Is my child eligible for free school meals?

Your child might be eligible if you access:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

Universal infant free school meals

Currently, pupils in reception, year 1 and year 2 are entitled to a free school meal thanks to a different government funding scheme known as universal infant free school meals (UIFSM). You shouldn't confuse UIFSM with free schools meals and the pupil premium.

If your child is in reception, year 1 or year 2 and is eligible for free school meals according to the criteria above, you should still register because we'll receive the extra pupil premium funding.

Does my child have to eat the free school meals?

No. Pupils who are registered for free school meals don't have to eat them. If you're eligible but you want your child to have packed lunches you should still register because the school will receive the funding which can support your child in other ways.

How do I register?

You only need to register once at the school.
